



# Living Legacy Tree Donations in Centennial Park

Create your own living legacy by donating to a tree in Centennial Parklands. The tree can become a focal point for family gatherings, commemorate a milestone, or provide a personal place for contemplation and quiet enjoyment.

There are two categories of pre-selected trees available which are defined by the Grand Drive loop. The primary difference between the two areas is the landscape - the Inner Park is cultivated and formal, the Outer Park is wild and unkempt. See the attached maps for available locations.

“Inner Park” tree – donation of \$10,000 for a 25 year period.

“Outer Park” tree – donation of \$7,500 for a 25 year period.

Donation package includes:

- choice of tree from availability
- dedication certificate, photos and location map
- subscription to our seasonal eNewsletter
- one year Centennial Parklands Foundation membership
- recognition on our website, in our annual report and on our electronic donor recognition
- a tile at our Celebration Steps (project in development) with a name of your choice\*
- 100% tax deductibility

At the completion of the 25 year period you will be given the first option to renew for a further donation. If you choose not to renew the tree will be made available for a new dedication.

# Inner Park locations

**Area 1** - located behind the Parklands Office overlooking Brazilians Fields and Frog Hollow. This area has a selection of Bunya pines, Norfolk Island pines and Hoop pines available.

**Area 2** - located along Dickens Drive. There is one Port Jackson fig available.

**Area 3** - located nearest to the Education Precinct, Centennial Park Labyrinth and the Celebration Steps (project underway). There are two young Port Jackson figs available.

**Area 4** - located at Church Grounds, in close proximity to the Duck Pond, Randwick Pond and the Equestrian Grounds. There are currently two trees available in this area - a Small leafed fig and a Hoop pine.



# Outer Park locations

**Area 1** - covers the area from Jervois Gates to Centennial Parklands Dining. This area has a Port Jackson fig and a Hoop pine available.

**Area 2** - located in the north-eastern corner of the Park nearest to Bondi Junction. There are three “sentinel” Hoop pines available here, each on a corner of the triangle formed by Broome Avenue, Loch Avenue and Carrington Road.

**Area 3** - located along the eastern edge of Federation Valley overlooking the Federation Pavilion. There are four Cook pines and a Queensland Kauri pine available.

**Area 4** - tucked away near the gates of York Road. There is a Hoop pine, a Norfolk Island pine and a Port Jackson fig available.

**Area 5** - along the southern edge of the Park. There is one Holm oak and two Port Jackson figs.
